Angie graduated from Goddard High School in 1971 and worked at the Roswell Boys and Girls club for several years. After high school she worked at Christmas by Krebs while attending ENMU-R to obtain her Associate of Arts Degree. In

Their love story began in 1974 and was filled with many dates at the Red Crow where they shared her favorite, Cherry-lime Coke. They married on July 17, 1976, at St. John's Catholic Church and started their family three years later.

Angie worked in the offices at Sears Robuck and later as a teller at Sunwest Bank. She eventually became a teacher's aide at Pecos Elementary and Washington Avenue where she was in charge of the HOST program. After years of growing to love making a difference in the lives of her students, she decided to go back to school to become an elementary school teacher. She attended and received her Bachelor's of Science Degree in Education and taught at Chisolm and Missouri Elementary. She worked for the Roswell Independent School District for 35 years before retiring. She missed her kids and couldn't stay away and returned to the school district as a substitute teacher for several more years before having to retire for good.

Angie loved to spend time with her family and after retirement her and her hubby enjoyed traveling to play her chi-ching machines at the casino and attend concerts. One of her favorite things to do was listen to music and she loved that she was able to see her favorite artists such Little Joe y La Familia, Kane Brown, and even Pit Bull. They attended over 65 concerts in their time together. Some of the things that brought her the most joy was spending time with her family on camping trips and vacations to California, Arizona, Washington, and the Bahamas. Hobbies she enjoyed were reading, crocheting, and watching her husband, children and grandchildren play sports. Angie was very proud of her children for their accomplishments and loved
