



Judy (Massey) Alberts

June 18, 1944 - September 21, 2017

Maria Julia Massey-Alberts, 73, passed away on Thursday, September 21, 2017. She loved to tell the story of the nuns who called her “Judy” when she first started school and the name stayed with her for the rest of her life. A Rosary will be held on Saturday, September 30, 2017, St. Peter’s Catholic Church, 9:30 AM, with a Memorial Service immediately following at 10:00 AM. On June 18, 1944, Judy was born as Maria Julia Guerrero to Alvaro J. and Adela (Salazar) Guerrero in Starr County, Texas. She was a Counselor and a Teacher in the Roswell School System for thirty-nine years. Judy attended Texas Woman’s University and UTEP where she attained Masters Degrees in English, Spanish and Counseling. She worked at Roswell High School, ENMU-R and finished her career counseling at Pecos Elementary School. Judy will always be loved and remembered by her students, the people she helped, and of course, family and friends who knew and loved her very much. Judy began the final chapter of her life when she married Don Alberts in March of 2003, both at the age of fifty-eight years. They took good care of each other and loved to go to St. Peter’s Catholic Church, where they had been married. They enjoyed playing Bingo and traveling together to Texas to visit with family and friends. Fifteen years later, they would tell everyone that they were still on their honeymoon. It was a Love like no other.

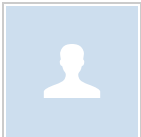
