A memorial service for Leonard “Dutch” Winterheld, 88, of Roswell will be held at 6:00 pm, Wednesday, April 13, 2011 at Mountain View Baptist Church in Roswell with Terry Johnson officiating. He passed away Thursday, April 7, 2011 at Sunset Villa Care Center in Roswell. Dutch was born June 26, 1922 in Aberdeen, South Dakota and born again on February 16, 1997 when he was baptized and accepted the Lord as his Savior. He was a fireman by trade achieving the rank of Fire Chief at Point Barrow, Alaska, and served as a combat fire chief during the Vietnam conflict. Dutch was a member of the United States Army during WWII and served in the 101st airborne. He parachuted into Normandy on “D-Day” where he was injured and received the Purple Heart and bronze star. Many of his loves included animals, baseball, aged whiskey, and sharing tall tales. Those left behind to cherish his memory are his children: Pamela Sonner of Texas, Harold Ross of Roswell, Richard Ross and wife Toni of Roswell and Glenn Ross and wife Lorene of Lahaina, Hawaii; grandchildren: Laura Weber of Taos, Kristin Eassa of Stewart, FL, Ryan Sonner of Atlanta, GA, Katelyn Ross of Roswell, and Kathryn Ross of Roswell; great grandchild Gabriella Weber; and many “adoptive” family and close friends. He was preceded in death by his daughter Angela Ross and wife Jean Ross both of Roswell.
