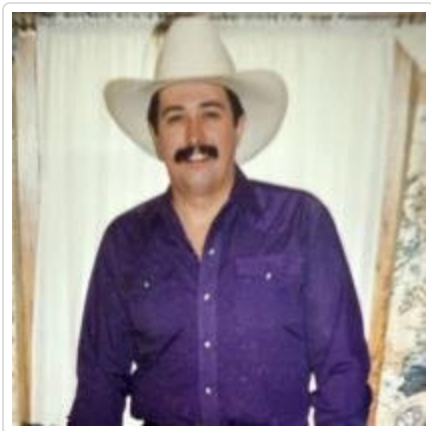




Richard Inge
