William (Watermelon Bill) Millard Lindsey, born June 30, 1923 in Chickasha Ok. Died March 25, 2011 at age 87. He married in 1951 to Teddy Beaty. He lived and worked in Oklahoma, New Mexico, and Arizona most of his life. Since 1983 he lived in Dexter, NM and became known as the Watermelon man because he traveled to Pecos, TX in the summers for watermelons to sell at the 40 mph curve near Dexter, NM. As a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints he served as Branch President in Chickasha, OK. He was a member of the Roswell stake and attended Roswell 2nd Ward and Artesia Branch.

He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Teddy Beaty Lindsey. His children, Ellis (Connie) Lindsey of Mesa, AZ, Judy (Dean) Miyasaki of Rexburg, ID, Elizabeth Ann Lindsey of Dexter, NM and 7 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.
