He was there for you at the drop of a hat when you needed him most. He loved to watch westerns especially John Wayne movies. New Mexico was his wild west; Lincoln County, Billy the Kid. Will was a big man in spirit, heart, and personality, not to mention his size. His eyes would crinkle when he would giggle, and he roared when he laughed. He had rhythm when he danced. He

was quick on his feet and ever so strong. He was artistic and creative. He liked being “off the grid.” He was a Jack of all trades and master of most. It was very important to him to teach the young ones life skills so they would be prepared for what life brought their way. Some of us adults learned a thing or two along the way as well.

Those left to eternally treasure and cherish his memory are his sisters, Heather Harrison and Lisa McLauchlin. His nephews Zachary and Seth Harrison and niece Serenity Harrison.
